LSS CHAIRPERSON'S ADDRESS

It gives me great pride to pen this address at a time when organised school sport in Lenasia continues to stand as a beacon of hope and resilience. In an era when many parts of Johannesburg have seen the decline of structured sporting activities, Lenasia remains one of the few areas where school sport is still alive, organised, and thriving.

Our journey has been long and filled with both challenges and triumphs. The roots of school sport in Lenasia go back to 1961, when our high schools first affiliated with SASSSA and, later, our primary schools with SAPSSA in 1988. Those were times of division, when sport was organised along racial lines, and opportunities for our learners were limited. Yet, through determination and community spirit, sport in Lenasia found its footing.

The establishment of SACOS in 1973 brought with it the vision of non-racial sport, though the challenges of funding and facilities were immense. In 1994, with the birth of our democracy, the United School Sport Association (USSASA) was formed to unify sport under one umbrella. It was during this period that Lenasia continued to shine, even though our learners often had to rely on fundraising to represent us at higher levels.

By 2004, the merger of our primary and secondary school structures gave birth to Lenasia School Sport (LSS). This unification brought strength, stability, and recognition. Under the stewardship of leaders such as Mr. M.I. Baker, LSS achieved the prestigious *Cluster of the Year Award* in 2005, while also pioneering mass participation programmes, hosting memorable mini-world cups, and ensuring that every child had a chance to experience the joy of sport.

Today, LSS proudly has 19 schools affiliated (Primary and Secondary), keeping the tradition of organised sport alive. Despite many challenges, we still successfully run a full sporting calendar: *athletics in Term 1; soccer, netball, volleyball, table tennis and chess on a league basis in Terms 2 and 3; and cricket in Term 4.* This means that, unlike many other areas where organised sport has collapsed, our learners in Lenasia have had continuous sport throughout the year — without pause.

As Chairperson, I must highlight this achievement. The lack of organised sport in the greater Johannesburg area is deeply concerning, and yet, here in Lenasia, we have ensured that our children are never left without opportunities to compete, to learn, and to grow. This is no small task, and it is only possible because of the unwavering dedication of our principals, teachers, coaches, parents, and community members.

Let us not take this for granted. Together, we must continue to protect and strengthen this legacy. Sport is not only about winning—it is about unity, discipline, resilience, and providing our learners with a platform to shine.

Lenasia's sporting journey has shown us one truth: facilities may be limited, resources may be scarce, but the spirit of sport, once ignited, can never be extinguished.

A GLIMPSE into SCHOOL SPORT in LENASIA

School Sport, like education, was organised along racial lines, under various education departments in the ‘ Old Transvaal Province ‘. School Sport was always viewed as the bedrock of sporting development and social cohesion. Since 1961, High Schools in Lenasia were part of the South African Senior Schools Sports Association (SASSSA). The Lenasia Primary Schools joined the South African Primary Schools Sport Association (SAPSSA) in 1988. Both SASSSA and SAPSSA, were affiliates of the non racial sports movement, namely, the South African Council of Sport (SACOS). SACOS was established in 1973 and served as the sports wing of the anti- apartheid liberation movement. SACOS, adopted a principled position through the slogan “No normal sport in an abnormal society” which ensured that sport could not be fundamentally divorced from broader social issues. The lack of adequate facilities and funding were always key stumbling blocks for all non-racial affiliates of SACOS in achieving their goals. In spite of these challenges, sports administrators that constituted a group of teachers on a voluntary mission, were able to develop sports programmes, organise fixtures, secured sponsorships, manage and train learners, officiate games etc. thus enabling learners to compete at community, provincial and national levels.

High Schools affiliated directly to Transvaal High Schools Sports Association. Schools were mainly from Lenasia, Bosmont, Eldorado Park and Ennerdale. SASSSA were demarcated into 9 regions, Boland, Border, Central, Eastern Province, Natal, North Western Districts, South Cape, Transvaal and Western Province. The following codes were offered, Athletics, Football, Netball, Volleyball, Rugby, Hockey, Chess, Gymnastics, Cross Country, Table Tennis, Tennis, Swimming, Cricket and Softball.

Primary schools had to affiliate to a geographical area. The areas were, Bosmont, Eldorado Park, Ennerdale, Lenasia and Reiger Park, they formed the Transvaal Primary Schools Sports Board. SAPSSA were constituted by 12 regions, Boland, Border, Eastern Province, Griqualand West, Karoo, Natal, Western Cape, North West Cape, Orange Free State, South Western Districts and Western Province. The primary schools offered similar codes to it’s counterparts in the high schools. SAPSSA’s last tournament was a Summer Codes tournament held in Atlantis – Western Cape in December 1994.

A GLIMPSE into SCHOOL SPORT in LENASIA

With the emergence of the new democratic order, it was incumbent on all school sport administrators to bring sport in schools in tandem with the objectives of the new constitution. The United School Sport Association (USSASA) was officially launched at the World Trade Centre in Johannesburg on the 26 November 1994. Sport organised within the Special Schools sector was also brought under the umbrella of USSASA. USSASA, also participated in the activities of the Confederation of School Sport Federation of Southern Africa (COSSASA) and the International School Sport Federation (ISSF). USSASA initially was divided into 21 regions, North West Province, Namaqualand, Western Province, Boland, South Western Districts, Eastern Province, Border, Transkei, Southern Free State, Eastern Free State, Northern Free State, KwaZulu Natal Northern Coastal, Kwazulu Natal Southern Coastal, Kwazulu Natal Midlands, Mpumalanga, South Gauteng, North West, Northern Province, North Gauteng and Griqualand West

In 2000, USSASA restructured and aligned to the 9 political provinces, namely, Gauteng, North West, Northern Cape, Western Cape, Eastern Cape, Kwazulu Natal, Limpopo, Mpumalanga and Free State. Issue of funding was still a contentious issue. Athletes had to fund raise to participate in National tournaments.

In 2004, USSASA was disbanded. The National Department of Sport & Recreation and the National Department of Education took over the administration of school sport. The National Sporting Codes became the implementing agency for School Sport. This is the status quo to date. National tournaments are organised according to the 9 politically demarcated provinces namely, Gauteng, North West, Northern Cape, Western Cape, Eastern Cape, Kwazulu Natal, Limpopo, Mpumalanga and Free State.

Initially, in Lenasia, Primary Schools, Secondary Schools and Special Schools administered their sport separately. In 2004, a historic move resulted in Primary and Secondary dissolving their structures to form, Lenasia School Sport (LSS) . This arrangement has stood the test of time. Currently LSS is affiliated to the Johannesburg Central District. The Gauteng Province is divided into 15 Districts.

TIMELINE : 1961 - 2025

1961 - South African Senior Schools Sports Association (SASSSA) was established on 5 April 1961, Nana Memorial Hall, Johannesburg. Mr N Rathinasamy was elected as the inaugural President and Mr R Feldman as Secretary.

1967 - The first inter primary athletics Meeting was held 26 October, Lenasia No.2 (Model) Primary hosted the event. It was under the banner of Western Districts Indian Inter Primary Sport Union. First Primary (Alpha), Lenasia Primary No.2 (Model), Park and Greyville Primary participated. First (Alpha) won the senior section and Greyville topped the Junior Section.

1973 - The South African Council of Sport (SACOS) was formed.

1985 - Mr N Rathinasamy (President) and Mr AR Moonsammy (Treasurer) were elected office bearers for SASSSA from until 1988. SASSA policy was that National office bearers were on rotational basis amongst provinces

1985 - A Gala Honours Function was held at the Lenasia Civic Centre. Mr BG Naidoo was at helm the Lenasia Primary Schools' Football Union and the Lenasia Primary Schools' Athletics Association . Mrs S Moonsammy was chair of the, Lenasia Primary Schools' Netball Union Netball.

1986 - Lenasia Primary Sports Coordinating Council was formed. Principals took control of running of the sport. The Council organised various codes under one controlling body. Affiliated schools at the time were, Alpha, Apex, Finetown, Flamingo, Greyville, Harmony, Highveld, Impala Crescent, Lenasia South Secondary, Libra, Model, Novena, Progress, Pentarosa and Sharicrest. Mr M Valli, Mr AS Munshi and Mr MM Ranchod played a leading role.

1988 - Lenasia Primary Schools Sport Council (LPSSC) was formed, Mr M Kahn was the inaugural chair. LPSSC affiliated to the Transvaal Primary Schools Board (TPPSB). Mr DB Eastwood (Chairperson), Mr CB Vergie (Secretary) and Mr I Hoff (Treasurer). TPSSB was affiliated to the South African Primary Schools Sports Association (SAPSSA). Mr MA Dharsey was SAPSSA President at the time. SAPSSA was established on 11 January 1965 in Cape Town.

TIMELINE : 1961 - 2025

1993 - The Lenasia High School Sport Committee was established. Mr AS Essack was the inaugural Chairperson. MR GJ Peters his Deputy. Affiliated schools were, Azara, Lenasia, MH Joosub, Nirvana, Topaz and Trinity.

1994 - Finally, School Sport was now under one umbrella body, the United Schools Sport Association of South Africa (USSASA). Mr G Fredericks was elected President, Mr J O' Connor, Secretary and Mr Mr M Kahn served on the executive as Minute Secretary. USSASA was officially launched at the World Trade Centre in Kampton Park on 26 November.

1997 - Mr AS Essack succeeded Mr M Kahn as Chairperson of LPSSC

2004 - Lenasia Primary Schools Sports Council (LPSSC) merged with the Lenasia High Schools Sports Committee (LHSSC), to form Lenasia School Sport (LSS). This historic move brought Primary and Secondary Schools in Lenasia under one umbrella. Mr MI Baker was elected Chairperson, Mr GJ Peters his Deputy, Mr B Ranchod (Treasurer) & Mz H Khan (Secretary).

2004 - USSASA was disbanded. The National Department of Sport & Recreation and the National Department of Education took over the administration of school sport. The National Sporting Codes became the implementing agency for School Sport. This is the status quo to date.

2013 - Mr J Smit was elected Chairperson of LSS.

2013 - Mr S Sujee, appointed Chef de Mission of Team Gauteng, at the SA Schools Championship held in Bloemfontein - Free State.

2015 - Mr K Naidoo, appointed Chef de Mission of Team Gauteng, at the SA Schools Championship held in Tshwane - Gauteng.

2017 - Mr M Naidoo was elected as Chairperson of LSS

2025 - Mr M Naidoo was re elected as Chairperson, Mz W Wasta (Secretary) and Mz A. Pachai (Treasurer).

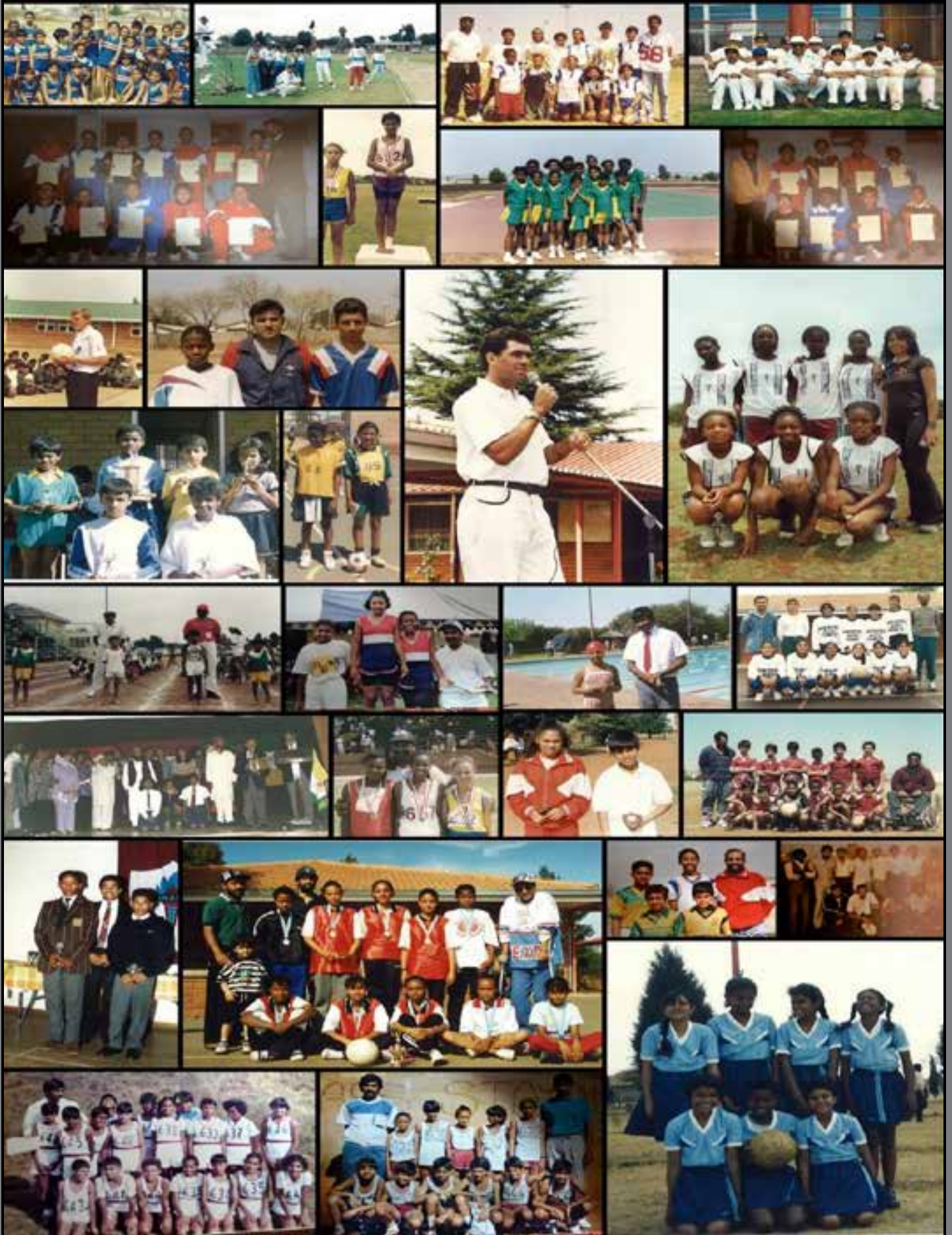

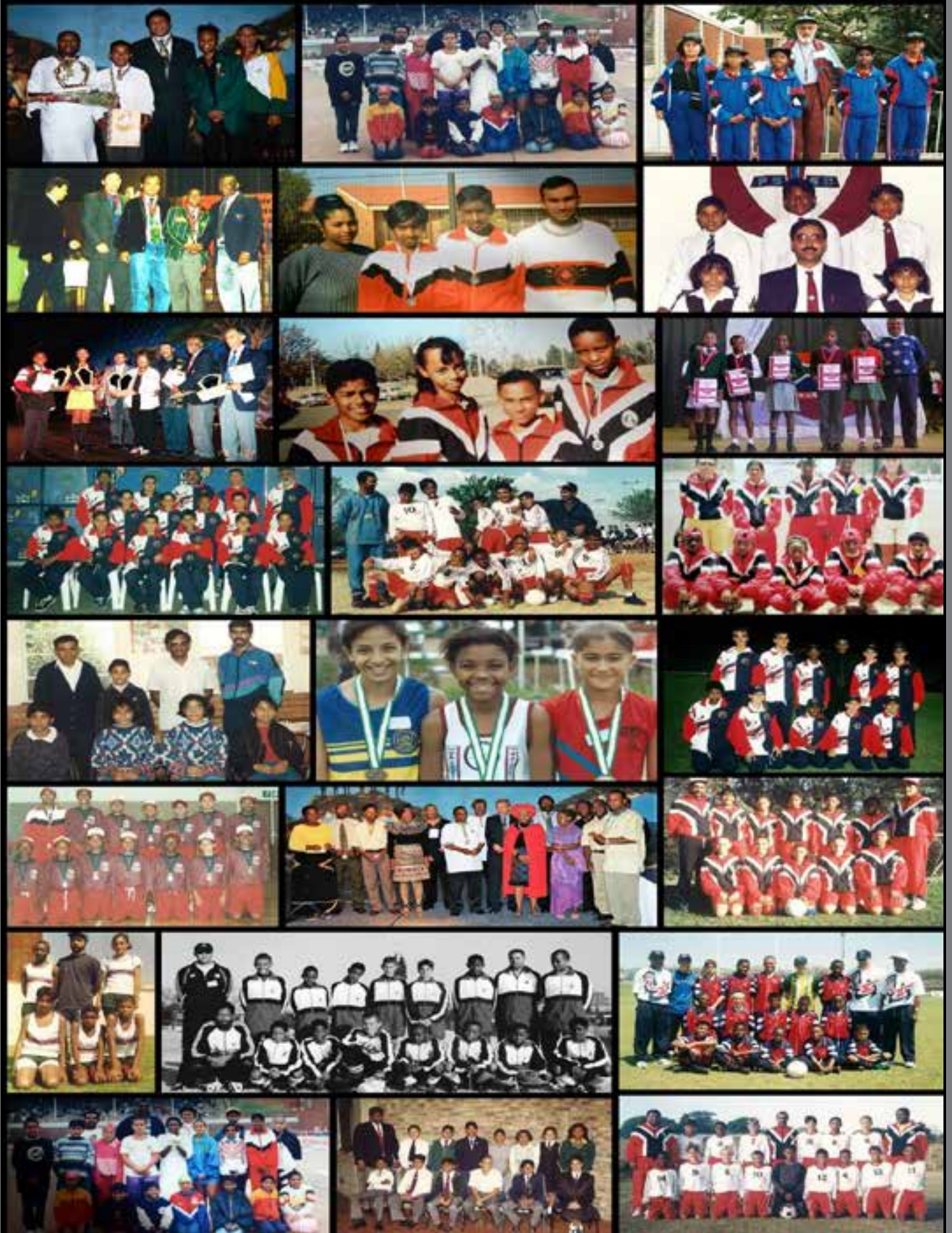

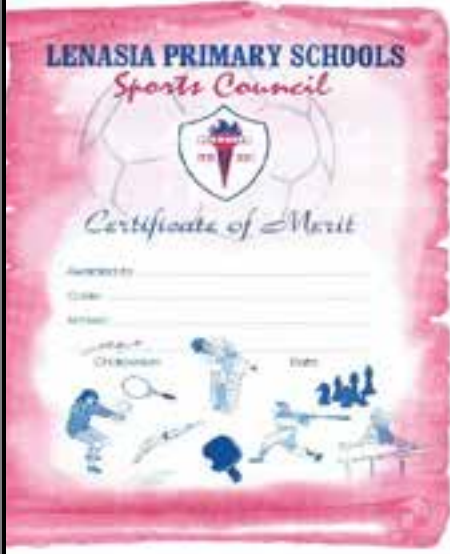
